Professional Associations

[American Evaluation Association](#): AEA is the official professional association of evaluators in the United States. It is the largest professional association of evaluators in the world. It contains a public library and peer reviewed evaluation journals (subscription only), public webinars, job opportunities, e-learning opportunities, and a listserve. Full-time students are offered a reduced membership rate.

[Canadian Evaluation Society](#): This is the professional association of evaluation in Canada. It contains a peer reviewed journal, professional opportunities, and webinars.

[International Organization for Cooperation in Evaluation](#): IOCE is an international partnership that provides global leadership in evaluation. It contains a document library and links to other evaluation organizations.

[African Evaluation Association](#): AfrEA is the professional association of evaluators in Africa. It has a resource library, and links to national level evaluation associations in Africa.

[My M&E](#): Managed by UNICEF and IOCE, this website contains a document library, e-learning opportunities, and job opportunities.
